# PREPARE TO BE SURPRISED





Situated at the western corner of Greece, it is the closest point to mainland Europe by sea, making it the first port of call when coming from Italy, a simple geographical fact which has shaped both its history, culture and architecture. The European influences of the past 500 years are clearly evident even today, yet Corfu is the only part of Greece never to fall to the Ottomans, which goes a long way to explain the 1000+ churches on the island, a staggering number even by Greek standards. So put aside all the stereotypes social media goes on about the Greek islands and start a new page of discovery of a very Greek island, *like no other.*



Distinguishable from afar by its two imposing Venetian fortresses, the old town of Corfu is reminiscent of Italy with its narrow streets, tall buildings and earthy colours, hardly surprising as it was built by the Venetians during the 16th century and later influenced by France and Britain, earning it a UNESCO World heritage title.

The royal palace of St. Michael and St. George, now the Museum of Asian Arts, Spianada, the largest square in the Balkans, which among others hosts a cricket field, Liston, a beautiful example of French architecture and flamboyance where the aristocracy would parade, the palace of Mon Repo, birthplace of The Duke of Edinburgh Prince Philip, are just a few of the highlights that differentiate Corfu from all the other islands. For centuries it has been a cherished destination by many notable people from all walks of life, including celebrities, royalty, scholars and artists, many of which have left their mark and are remembered to date.

Putting aside the countless highlights of the island for a moment, the inquisitive traveller can find gems hidden in plain sight everywhere from the backstreets of the old city, to the quaint villages scattered across the hills of the north.

# THE OLD CITY





Understandably, the old city is often dismissed as nothing more than a tourist attraction, but taking a few steps away from the busy shops into the narrow back streets quickly reveals a very different picture.

Locals going about their daily lives, enjoying privileges that no big town can offer for any amount of money. Work, schools, shopping, medical care, entertainment, beaches, parks, sports, the oldest university, theatre and tennis club of Greece, a port and airport, a subtropical forest, a nature reserve, more historical sites, churches, monuments and museums anyone would like to count, in what can only be summarised as a Hollywood movie set.

*All this, within walking distance.*









## The most visited, unknown village in Corfu.

Achilleion, the palace of Empress Elisabeth of Austria, is among the five most visited historical sites in the whole of Greece, which by definition makes Gastouri the most frequented inland village of the island, if not Greece. Of the million plus visitors who will spend an hour or two wondering what it was like to party at this extravagant location a century ago, only a handful will ever find out that Gastouri was in fact, one of the wealthiest villages in Corfu, well before the Achilleion palace was built.

The first clue for this wealth is found in its name, originating from the word 'gastri', a pot.

On a fertile island such as Corfu where most people were (and still are) self-sufficient for food, skills such as pottery, carpentry, ironmongery, were the 'power industries' that could generate serious wealth. Testament are the numerous mansions and considerably better dwellings than most other villages still standing today.





# ACHILLEION PALACE





## SECRETS IN PLAIN SIGHT

What history cannot explain, are the imposing houses and countless villas dotted amongst the many hills and forests of Gastouri, far too many to be there by chance. There are in fact several good reasons why the Achilleion and so many other exclusive properties chose Gastouri to be their home, reasons which quickly become apparent with a short hike from Achilleion villas to the hilltop of Ay. Kyriaki church.

It may take a moment or two to catch your breath, if not from the hike, most certainly from the view. Stunning as the view may be, most of the qualities which make this region so attractive to disarming people are known only to locals, perhaps just as well, since Gastouri remains one of the few parts of the island to escape mass tourism.

With an average elevation of 100-150 meters, surrounded by lush vegetation and deep forests, the region of Gastouri enjoys a cooler and drier summer than most other parts of the island, while being close to the town centre, some of the finest beaches on the south west and the east

coast, the new marina in Benitses for yachting, the Angsana Spa Resort for some pampering, 30 min from the Corfu Golf Club and the largest horse riding center of the island and finally, at the end of your day, some really good places to eat.



Gastouri has long been the choice of people who appreciate unspoilt nature, privacy, mild climate, easy access to entertainment, sports and all that the town has to offer. For some, it is simply the only location to spend a vacation, or indeed to live.






DISCOVER THE UNEXPECTED

# THE BEACHES

The point where water meets land, one of the most common geographical features on planet Earth is main reason more than 20 million people visit Greece every year, a baffling notion for locals who have no clue what it is to live in a country where a sunny day makes news headlines and blue waters is something they see only screensavers.

Browsing for seaside destinations, Greece may not live up to images from the Caribbean, West Indies or other exotic destinations, but it more than makes up for it with qualities not apparent on any video.

With thousands of beaches to choose from, there are choices for every taste, budget and preference, all with warm, safe waters served by friendly people, topped with cool drinks, good food and endless parties.

Corfu takes all this and adds the colour green, offering more than 120 easily accessible beaches, some of which could easily be mistaken for being in the Caribbean. Add a small boat to your itinerary and you have access to beaches you wish food delivery by drones was already a reality.

This extraordinary variety of beaches is thanks to its unique geology which varies with every turn of the compass. The south west coast, arguably the most impressive coastline of the island, is a blend of golden sandy beaches, interrupted by rugged cliffs and dark green forests with Paleokastritsa as the crown jewel of this string of pearls. Cosy coves surrounded by jagged rocks, long, soft, sandy beaches with five star hotels and restaurants, secluded hideouts between cliffs, will keep you wanting for more, well after you have left the island.







# UNREAL COLOURS




The southern tail of the island being the flattest region, is characterised by very long, golden beaches, many of which rarely get crowded even at the peak of summer, frequented by people who prefer basic amenities and enjoy nature as nature intended it. The Korission lagoon between Halikounas and Issos beach is one such example, a designated nature reserve where flamingoes spend the winters, next to one of the rarest cedar forests in the world, rooted in sand dunes, despite the powerful winter winds.





Sheltered from the strong southerlies of autumn and westerlies during the summer, the east coast has little in common with the rest of the island's coastlines. With a few notable exceptions, it is characterized by rocky, harsh beaches and much darker waters due to the rare seaweed that proliferates in these waters, which by many, makes the fish the tastiest in Greece. True or not, the local fish is exceptional, aficionados often choosing small varieties such as sardines, white bait and when in season, small red mullet, slow fried in olive oil, dressed just with salt and lemon juice. The east coast compensates for its lack of luxurious sandy beaches with calm, clean waters all summer long, perfect for relaxed swimming, snorkelling and lazy sailing.



# MOUNTAIN MEETS SEA



All this is in stark contrast to the predominantly rocky north east coastline, which starts from the foothills of mount Pantokratoras with fine pebble beaches, gradually being replaced by volcanic rocks dropping into the sea, interrupted by small bays offering shelter to boaters and some of the finest seafood restaurants on the island.



The mountainsides reveal hundreds of villas built amongst the olive trees which defy the volcanic rocks and set roots. Limited and often challenging road access has the benefit of providing privacy, combined with the stunning views and shelter from strong summer winds, making the north east coast the single most valuable real estate on the island. Ironically, just 50 years ago these lands were considered worthless.



# THE NORTH EAST COAST



# NORTH TO WEST

Beyond the port of Kassiope, the north, fully exposed to the westerlies, once again changes its colours and textures to the point you may well think it's a different island altogether. Long sandy beaches alternate with inaccessible rugged coastlines, creating a blend of untouched nature and touristic hot spots, sometimes referred to as the wild north, Mount Poantokratoras standing proud behind adds a touch of extra drama.





Staying true to its diverse character, the west coast reveals yet another very different picture, one could say almost artistic, starting from the sandstone carvings of Instagrams favourite Canal De Amour, to the long cliffs of Sunset beach at Peroulades and the hard to get to Cape Drastis in the middle, all fighting for attention. These magnificent sculptures of nature are the result of powerful winds and waves which, when in full swing demand respect.

Finding your favourite beach in Corfu is often a futile pursuit, as different places attract and excite in different ways, with the expression “it can’t get any better than this”, becoming repetitive. But for those who do persist, the reward is priceless.



## NATURE EXTRAORDINAIRE

To state but the obvious, compared to the rest of Greece Corfu is an island blessed unfairly by nature, a fact often taken for granted by anyone growing up here, thinking the rest of the world must be just as wonderful, which is why it was the extraordinary life experience of the Durrell family that made the rest of the world aware of Corfu's nature

Possibly the most significant element for the island's fertility and abundance is the weather, defined by four distinct, yet mild seasons, despite the effects of global warming. These near perfect climate cycles go a long way in maintaining nature balanced, where all forms of life fair well, including humans.

Thanks to this abundance of food, water and timber, Corfu became an essential stop for ships

travelling between Greece and Rome five centuries ago, evidence being the Venetian shipyard still standing next to Marina Gouvia, one of the island's several natural harbours. It wasn't long before the rest of the island's qualities were appreciated by royalty, scholars, artists and the wealthy who came to recover from serious illnesses, to be inspired, or simply spend their summers.

There is no other island in Greece which can boast three royal palaces, countless mansions and possibly the longest list of influential people that have left their mark on the island. A trend which continues to this day during the summer months, with mega yachts rushing to secure the best anchorage and private jets anxious to secure parking in the airport.



# OLIVES

Dating back to 3500BC, olive trees in Greece are as common as rocks, with the exception of some really old 500+ year old examples, olive groves are not something that normally attract attention, that is until you take a drive on the south west coast of Corfu where olive groves have been transformed into forests. Massive forest as far as the eye can see, often exceeding 30 meters in height replacing the blue sky with a dark green canopy that provides shelter from extreme weather, in turn creating a new ecosystem.

This being the result of some unusual financial

circumstances dating back some 400 years.

Venice, the first city in the world to have street lamps became known as the city of light, lamps fueled by olive oil. Corfu, then a colony of Venice, was commissioned to plant and produce vast quantities of olive oil to keep their streets illuminated. This simple necessity created an entire industry with the planting of some 3 million olive trees, until gas replaced olive oil. Suddenly no one needed these huge quantities of low quality olive oil, so the trees were simply left to grow creating these massive, 300+ year old forests which stand today.

These vast expanses of perennial trees create a significant drop in ambient temperature encouraging rain, which in turn encourages other forms of plants, which increase rainfall even more, transforming Corfu into the greenest island in Greece by a huge margin. Viewing the surrounding landscapes from the peak of Mount Pantokratoras, the colours alone are sufficient proof of how different Corfu is.

Be it on land, sea, or air, life on this island thrives with little effort and remarkable balance, despite the efforts of the most intelligent lifeform on this planet.

# SPORTING ACTIVITIES



Planning a Greek island holiday begins with finding the beach of your dreams and accommodation to suit. Sun, sea, food, drink, places to party abound everywhere. Everything else is optional. Sports, even water sports, are often an afterthought, something to justify overindulgence, or the opportunity to try something new, a change of routine. Whatever the incentives, few are those who plan a sporting holiday to Greece. Totally understandable.



The simple truth is that Corfu is not an ideal destination for any single sport. Confusingly, this makes it a good place for many sports on a recreational level, perfect for when you are on holiday. Hiking and cycling, the simplest of all sporting activities, are just delightful during spring and autumn, from lonely beaches to mountain goat trails, forgotten back roads through forests and remote villages, there are routes to take it slow with a camera, or work up an appetite for a feast.



But it's the irresistible turquoise waters of the Ionian where everyone wants to be during the summer months, with more than 120 beaches to choose from, most of the larger organized ones offer the usual assortment of water sports one expects to find these days. Corfu is particularly well suited to calm water activities such as water skiing, scuba diving, snorkelling, stand up paddle boarding, kayaking, which explains the notable scarcity of wind sports. Certain parts of the island exposed to the moderate afternoon sea breezes do offer some basic sailing boats and windsurf boards, but they are few and far between.

It is this lack of strong winds which puts a lot of smiles on everyone else's faces, boaters can enjoy many days of tranquil waters, clear waters make snorkelling and scuba diving a joy, swimmers can choose their favourite beach anywhere on the island without the threat of being sandblasted and sun bathers don't have run after flying umbrellas. With the exception of those few days when the winds do become quite frisky, the Ionian waters are considered relatively safe, without extreme currents, tide or dangerous sea creatures.



Family friendly as many beaches are, the sea does not forgive reckless or stupid behaviours, basic precautions and common sense should always prevail be it on land, but especially at sea. One could easily spend an entire summer by the beach, but Corfu offers a number of surprising alternatives which do not require getting wet.



Sweating for pleasure when on holiday, unsurprisingly is not everyone's idea of the perfect summer holiday on an island as gentle as Corfu. With a rich history and culture in the arts, notably music, literature and painting, Corfu once again surprises newcomers with its 16 full marching philharmonic societies that offer free music lessons to children, a tradition which has resulted in one quarter of the local population to be musically trained.

The extraordinary number of royal palaces, mansions and aristocratic homes have attracted countless famous artists throughout the history of Corfu, who's creations can be found in local museums and private collections. The Corfu reading society maintains a library of rare literary works, while the author of the national anthem, Dionisios Solomos enjoys his own museum, well worth visiting.



This cultural wealth is the foundation of various art classes on offer every summer that include, but may not be limited to painting, pottery, glass works, photography and of course music.

Corfu may be one of the best European seaside destinations to spend summers, but it can keep many people very happy, all year round.

# FOOD



Are two ingredients which determine the fate of any travel. Get these two right and everything else can be forgiven, well almost. Even with all the reviews, guides and unbiased opinions available at our fingertips nowadays, finding the food that suits your pallet is always a challenge. Having an understanding of the local produce and what to look for in a dish, goes a long way into making your trip one to remember, rather than forget.

# & DRINK



Greek cuisine is fundamentally simple in preparation, relying on good produce, fresh herbs from the garden and of course generous volumes of olive oil for those deep, rich flavors it is known for, almost always complemented with feta and or yogurt. Neighbouring regions have added their own influences to these core values, Italian being the dominant one in Corfu. Sofriot and Pastitsatha are the signature meat dishes of Venetian origin, while bourthedo and bianco are the corresponding fishy dishes.

Needless to say you can find all the usual offerings on which Greeks grew up on, from mousaka to gemista just about anywhere, but in popular tourist hotspots it may take some effort to source freshly made, authentic recipes. Traditional Greek dishes are and will always be crowd pleasers for their simple, hearty, honest flavors, the best examples are easier to be found in the villages away from tourist hot spots, better still, if you can sweet talk a local mama to prepare a few extra portions from her kitchen, you will be hard pressed to find something better from any taverna. The same applies for the many kinds of grilled meats, Greeks tend not to marinate or even tenderize their meats, relying on its raw quality to make the difference. Corfu is well known for its slow roasted whole lamb, a must have for easter, but ever present at all

major summer festivals throughout the island, so getting your fingers oily is never difficult.

But it's the local fish which takes the crown as the most prized food to put on a plate. Lightly grilled, dressed with salt, olive oil, lemon juice is the way to appreciate just how good freshly caught wild Ionian fish is. No sauces, no side dishes, no salads, no dips, not even herbs. If you can trust the source of the fish, this is the only way for sea food aficionados to enjoy the catch of the day. Better still, be at the local market of Corfu town early in the morning and be spoiled for choice. If available, get some 'almyricha', a grass which grows on seaside rocks, naturally salty, lightly boiled, it adds an extraordinary dimension to any grilled fish.



What Greek cuisine lacks in sophistication, makes up for it with some exceptional ingredients. Olive oil, yogurt, Ionian fish, meat from the northern mountains, grains and legumes from select regions, ancient varieties

of tomatoes, cucumbers and other vegetables, fresh salads and herbs from the garden, such simple things that are becoming ever so scarce the bigger and more 'developed' a city becomes.

Like all popular destinations in the World, Greece is also a victim of stereotypical things to do and places to see, something that suits the tourist industry rather well, but at the cost of denying many people the thrill of true adventure, discovery and ultimately memories which are unique to them, not shared with millions of others.

Every person's idea of the ultimate travel experience is and should be unique, which, by definition there cannot be any 'top things to do and see'. By all means learn all you can about a destination, but if you want to find your place in Greece, that one place which makes you feel like a Greek God, where you are on top of the World, break away from the crowd and carve out your own route.
